Module 2.5: Standard 2 Field Training Course

Standard 2 - Forest to Landscape: Structure, Function and Dynamics Demonstrable Competency: 5) Demonstrate the integration of the individual elements of the standard

Course Description

The overall objectives of Module 2.5 are to integrate student's knowledge and comprehension of the various demonstrable competencies that comprise Standard 2. Specific objectives are for students to apply field techniques for describing the components, characteristics, and processes of forest ecosystems, describing classification schemes using various characteristics, explaining the influences and outcomes of agents of change on forests and landscapes, and explaining the concept of measures of diversity and putting it into use. Integrating these objectives will occur in the field through exercises, which, for example, simultaneously require the use of classification schemes to measure diversity of fauna, flora, and a variety of landscape features. This field training will include a final assignment that is based on data and information collected by the students in the field.
